**"Humility is the mother of all virtues; purity, charity and obedience. It is in being humble that our love becomes real, devoted and ardent. If you are humble nothing will touch you, neither praise nor disgrace, because you know what you are. If you are blamed you will not be discouraged. If they call you a saint you will not put yourself on a pedestal."**

In today's Gospel Reading Jesus receives and accepts an invitation from a Pharisee. At first sight he seems to offer a lesson on etiquette. Luke, however, calls the passage "a parable". Later on, the scribes are characterized as those who love "the places of honour at banquets". Jesus made that the object of a warning: One who has seated himself "in a place of honour" must yield place to the eminent guest for whom that place had been reserved, and since the other places will have been filled, must take the lowest place ... We are taken beyond the perspective of human relations and assured that God is no respecter of persons. The drift of the parable is clear: the scribes and Pharisees arrogated to themselves privileges and demanded preferential treatment because of their observance of the Law and their condition as "religious people". They took for granted that God would see things in this way too and render them like preferential treatment: the first places in the kingdom. Here they are warned that they may be fortunate to get the lowest places. St Luke, who last Sunday showed us the universalist note of his Gospel, today, shows us his concern for the poor and afflicted: they will take the first places at the messianic feast in heaven, because there were meek, gentle, kind, and humble. Pride and self-glorification raise a barrier to God's graciousness and to communion with our fellows.

## Pope Leo will canonize Pier Giorgio Frassati and Carlo Acutis together on 7 September.

The canonizations of the two young saints—one from the early twentieth century, the other the first twenty-first-century saint—have been greatly anticipated due to the great devotion among the faithful.

### Announcement by Pope Francis

The late Pope himself had announced the canonizations of Bls. Pier Giorgio and Carlo at the General Audience of 20 November 2024, prompting thunderous applause from the crowds gathered in St. Peter's Square.



The canonization of Acutis, who was beatified in Assisi on 10 October 2020, had originally been scheduled for 27 April, the Second Sunday of Easter, to coincide with the Jubilee of Teenagers, while Frassati's canonization had been set for 3 August, the culmination of the Jubilee for Youth.

The postponement of Blessed Carlo's canonization was announced on the day of Pope Francis' death, 21 April, and it was widely assumed that Blessed Pier Giorgio's canonization would similarly be delayed.

### First reading: Sirach 3:17-18, 20, 28-29

My son, perform your tasks in meekness; then you will be loved by those whom God accepts. The greater you are, the more you must humble yourself; so you will find favour in the sight of the Lord. For great is the might of the Lord; he is glorified by the humble. The affliction of the proud has no healing, for a plant of wickedness has taken root in him. The mind of the intelligent man will ponder a parable, and an attentive ear is the wise man's desire.

### Second reading: Hebrews 12:18-19, 22-24a

Brothers and Sisters: You have not come to what may be touched, a blazing fire and darkness and gloom and a tempest and the sound of a trumpet and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that no further messages be spoken to them. But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God, the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant.

**Gospel Acclamation:** Alleluia. Alleluia. Take my yoke upon you, says the Lord, and learn from me, for I am gentle and lowly in heart. Alleluia.

### Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7-14

One Sabbath, when Jesus went to dine at the house of a ruler of the Pharisees, they were watching him carefully.

Now he told a parable to those who were invited, when he noticed how they chose the places of honour, saying to them, 'When you are invited by someone to a wedding feast, do not sit down in a place of honour, lest someone more distinguished than you be invited by him, and he who invited you both will come and say to you, "Give your place to this person", and then you, with shame, will take the lowest place. But when you are invited, go and sit in the lowest place, so that when your host comes he may say to you, "Friend, move up higher." Then you will be honoured in the presence of all who sit at table with you. For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.'

He said also to the man who had invited him, 'When you give a dinner or a banquet, do not invite your friends, or your brothers and sisters or your relatives or rich neighbours, lest they also invite you in return and you be repaid. But when you give a feast, invite the poor, the crippled, the lame, the blind, and you will be blessed, because they cannot repay you. For you will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.'

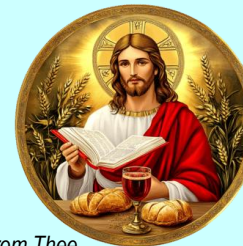
